Daniel Karrer Durch die Hecke

Daniel Karrer's painting blends the possibilities of the digital age with the qualities of traditional painting techniques. Karrer researches, combines, and archives image fragments of places, things, and situations that serve his pictorial worlds as a motivic point of departure. His visual idiom consists of contrasts between nature and artifice, landscape and architecture, and in some cases also between human figures. Partly composed of disharmonies of perspective and compositional distortions, his work presents the viewer with manifold contrasts between sombre tones and brightly luminous details. Karrer radically spells out spatial situations, as a curious collagist who integrates an array of heterogeneous elements with vivid brushstrokes. Here, the banal, mysterious, and uncanny meet to create a relaxed equilibrium – here, the surfaces of civilisation happen upon moments at which the atmosphere appears to keel over into its opposite.

«When I see or think of the number four, then the colour yellow always comes into play. Not that I actually behold the colour yellow when I see the number four; but it is precisely that colour that appears before my mind's eye. I think it.» — Synaesthetic perceptions find expression in Karrer's approach to painting. Style and subject are interrelated, just as melody and poetry are in a piece of music. They interact, complement each other, and extend each other's meaning. Karrer's paintings are not translations of illusions, but themselves reality in a sense. His themes at once carry and occasion his painting – thus making painting itself his theme. – tg

After earning a BA in Art Education from Basel Academy of Art and Design and following an exchange for painting students at Leipzig Academy of Visual Arts, he completed an MA in Fine Arts at Basel Academy of Art and Design. He lives and works in Basel, CH.
